- 217 victims of acute violence and consequently suffering from depression, mental health issues, unstable family relationships, physical and psychological trauma, and substance abuse, engaged in holistic and intensive Counseling.

The three main purposes of the Mary and Joseph Life Center

- a) OFFER Pregnant women and girls, fathers responsible for the pregnancy, and families, who are considering and/or are being coerced to have abortions, other options to have their baby(ies) born.
- **b) OFFER** Educational workshops/seminars that are oriented to help prevent crisis pregnancies and help those already in need with supportive guidance for psychological, spiritual and economic livelihood resilience.
- c) OFFER Counseling, medical support, guidance, and empowerment to women who have had abortions and are seeking assistance for trauma, self-esteem and healing in one form or another.
